Under the previous heading the fertilizing value of cover crops, especially the legumes, was briefly discussed. The judicious use of such crops where conditions will permit of their growth will result in good tree growth, and the production of big crops of good fruit without the addition of other fertilizers. It must be remembered, however, that nitrogen is the only essential element of plant food that is added to the soil by plants of the family Leguminosa. Indirectly they serve another valuable purpose in that they greatly improve...
